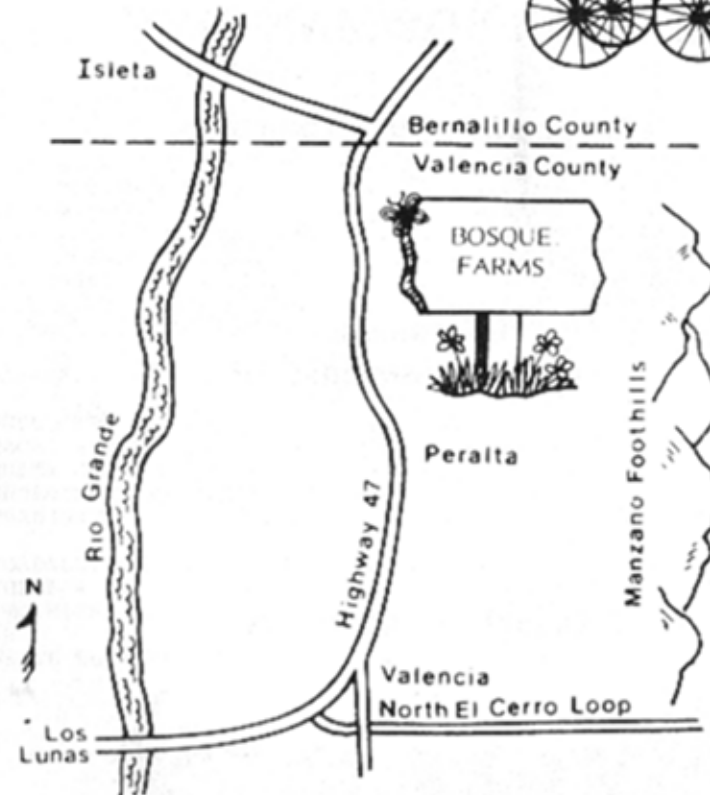

A BRIEF HISTORY OF BOSQUE FARMS

Our history begins in 1500, when the Tewa Indians lived in our valley. Then the early Spanish settlers arrived. The Spanish colonists claimed the new world for Spain, and were granted land.

Don Solomon Luna had large land holdings in this area. When he died, his son, Don Eduardo Otero, used 28,000 acres for grazing cattle and farming.

In 1934, this land was used by the U. S. Government for rehabilitation of farm families from the Great Dust Bowl of northern New Mexico, Texas and Oklahoma. The 28,000 acres were divided into 42 tracts, 40 to 80 acres per tract.

On May 1, 1935, a public drawing was held, and the tracts were sold to those lucky enough to have their names drawn. The land sold for \$140 per acre, and the new residents had 40 years to pay for it.

The new settlement became known as Bosque Farms. The Works Progress Administration (WPA) cleared the land and built homes for the new settlers. Many of the Spanish style adobe homes are still in use today.

In 1936, WPA built the original Bosque Farms School, which is still in use. At that time it taught students grades 1 - 8. Bosque Farms was the first school in the state to serve hot lunches to their students.

Recreation was community created. Dances, softball games and community dinners were popular.

In 1939, the first community fair was originated by Mrs. Crystal Carpenter. It grew larger and more popular each year. Our annual fair is the only community fair still celebrated in New Mexico. It reflects the great pride Bosque Farms residents still have in our community.

The residents voted to incorporate in 1974, and although Bosque Farms is now a small town instead of a dairying community as in the past, we still value our rural roots and our unique fair. We offer many thanks to all the volunteers who have worked so hard over the years to keep this tradition alive and growing - bigger and better every year!

It is hoped that she will represent Bosque Farms at the Valencia County Fair Queen Contest, but it is not required. If the winner chooses to compete at Valencia County, she will receive a cash award to sponsor her effort, as well as the crown, buckle and various items donated by individuals and businesses in the community. The cash award is sponsored jointly by the Bosque Farms Fair Board and the Bosque Farms Rodeo Association.

A winner who chooses not to compete at Valencia County will not receive the cash award, but will receive all other items.

A Princess candidate must be a single girl, between the ages of twelve (12) and fifteen (15), as of September 1 this year. The winner will be selected on the same basis as the Queen.

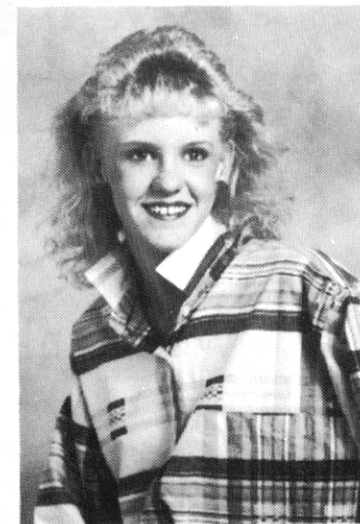

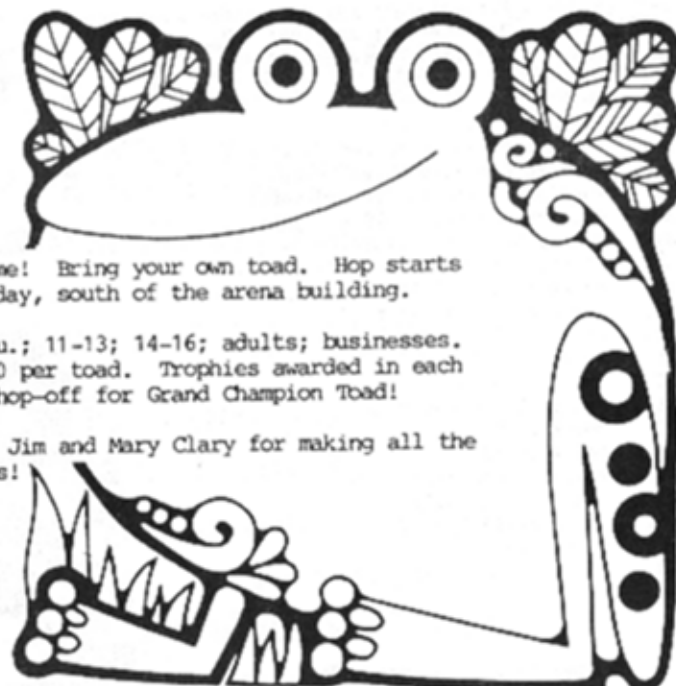

8. Class entries close as the previous class enters the ring.
9. There will be a two minute gate.
10. No stallions will be shown by anyone under age 19.
11. Payback on Bareback on a dollar will be winner take all.
12. 4-H class contestants must ride their project horse.
13. All contestants under 18 must have their parent/guardian sign the entry form.
14. Show committee decisions are final and committee reserves the right to refuse any entry. Show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes.

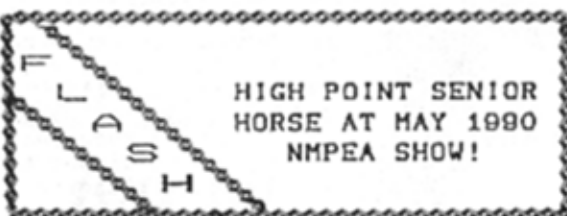

Outdoor Rules and Regulations

1. Entries must be pre-registered either Thursday afternoon, between 4:00 & 6:30 P.M., or Friday morning, 8:00 - 12:00 noon at the pre-registration table in the Arena Building.
2. Only Pre-registered animals will be accepted for showing.
3. No one, except superintendents, is permitted within 25 feet of the judges during the judging, except when exhibitors are required to show their animals.
4. The Same animal may not be shown in both youth and open, however, the same youth may show different animals in youth and open classes.
5. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner and must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair. (YOUTH: See rule 3 below)
6. All animals presented for exhibition shall be free from contagious and infectious diseases or parasites. Any diseased animal will be removed from the grounds.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for their own animals and must provide their own feed and water, as well as feed and water containers. All animals must be provided throughout the day with fresh, clean water. No responsibility is assumed for animals not picked up at the appropriate time.
8. There may be a shortage of changes for rabbits or poultry.
9. Stalls and pens must be neatly kept.
10. Animals in livestock classes must be groomed and in show condition.
11. The General Superintendent reserves the right to refuse entry or judging of any animal which, in his or her judgment, is not in suitable health or show condition, is not being properly cared for, or has been subject to unethical practices such as doctoring, doping of "filling". The General Superintendent's judgment is final.

Rules and Regulations — Youth Organizations

1. General rules 1-11 apply.
2. Youth exhibits must be from 4-H or FAA projects in which the exhibitor is currently enrolled.
3. All STEERS must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 150 days and all other animals for a period of at least 3 months under supervision of County Agent or Vocational Agriculture Instructor.
4. The care and fitting of animals is the responsibility of the exhibitor. If instruction and assistance is required, the exhibitor must be present and involved.
5. Weight requirements necessary for entry to the County or State Fairs do not apply.

WHAT IS 4-H?

4-H is the youth education program of the Cooperative Extension Service, established in 1914, and conducted jointly by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, the state land-grant universities, and county governments.

Today's 4-H program is for all youth-rural and urban-from all racial, cultural, economic, and social backgrounds. It reaches girls and boys in a variety of ways: as members of organized 4-H clubs, as participants in special interest groups, as enrollees in short-term projects, through camping, and in programs planned to meet specific needs of youth and the communities where they live. Girls and boys "learn by doing" in 4-H.

4-H gives young people an opportunity to take an active part in learning about and solving problems that face them and their communities. Members participate in projects that give them knowledge of science, agriculture, home economics, personal development, community service, leadership, and citizenship. Often this knowledge helps open the door to a future career. **BUT THE MAIN PURPOSE OF 4-H IS TO HELP YOUTH BECOME EFFECTIVE CITIZENS.**

Some of the 4-H projects most popular with youth are: food-nutrition, clothing, home beautification, health, safety, and leadership. In rural areas, many 4-H members work with livestock, crops, forestry and machinery. Also popular everywhere are projects in electricity, conservation, home gardening, photography, public speaking, woodworking, entomology, and personal grooming. Older boys and girls find satisfaction and challenge in projects in automotive care, career studies, money management, consumer education, and leadership. In Valencia County, some of the largest projects are rodeo, horsemanship, livestock judging, leathercraft, and dog obedience.

4-H clubs reorganize each October and November, and if you have a skill to share or a child interested in a worthwhile activity that is also fun, contact the Valencia County Extension Service at 865-9561 to find out what clubs are available in your area. **VOLUNTEER LEADERS ARE ALWAYS NEEDED!**

Superintendent: Sharon Eastman

1. Entries in the 4-H Department are limited to members of clubs located within the fair map boundaries, (see page 7), including the Bosque Farms, Drifters, and Outlaws 4-H clubs.
2. Members must be enrolled in the projects in which they exhibit, with the exception of an "open" category in each project for exhibits by 4-H members who are not enrolled in that particular project. "Open" categories will be judged separately and will not be eligible for Best of Show awards.
3. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per category, and not more than three entries per lot.
4. Exhibits must have been made within the past year.
5. General rules for inside exhibits apply, but special rules for 4-H take precedence over all other rules.
6. Categories are patterned after Valencia County Fair 4-H categories and correspond in most cases to State Fair 4-H categories. New categories will not be made by the superintendent unless it is for a new project or a project unique to a certain club. Requirements for such new categories will have to be provided by a club leader to the department superintendent.
7. Project requirements change periodically and the exhibit categories are not listed in this fair book. Contact your leader or the County Extension Office (865-9561) exactly what you are to exhibit.
8. Each lot will be divided into Novice (9-11), Junior (12-13), and Senior (14-19), and each division will be judged separately.
9. Best of Show awards will be given in the following categories:
ARTS: Floral design, cake decorating, needlework, photography
CRAFTS: Woodwork, leathercraft, welding, braiding
EDUCATIONAL: Posters, displays, rocketry, small pets, health

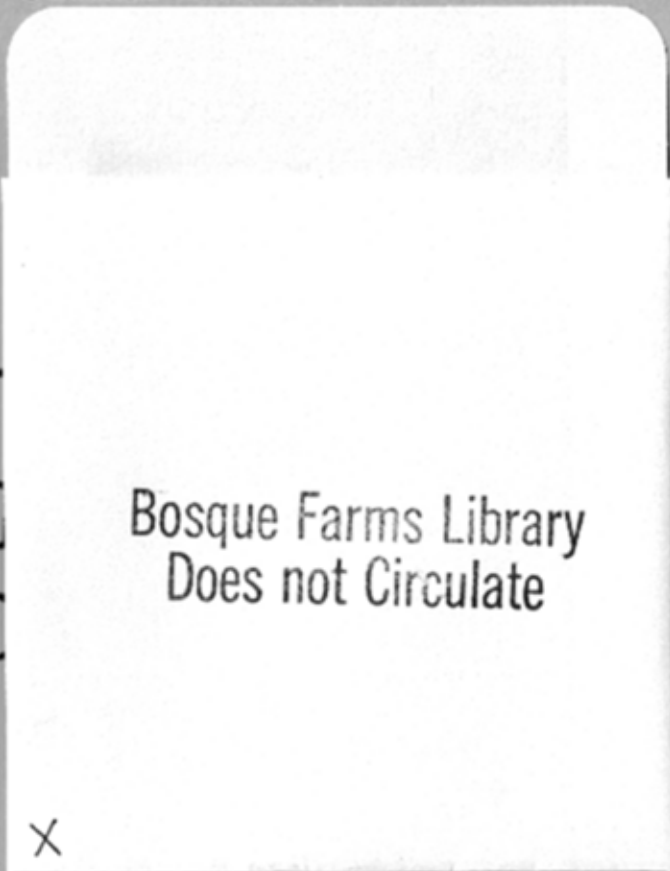

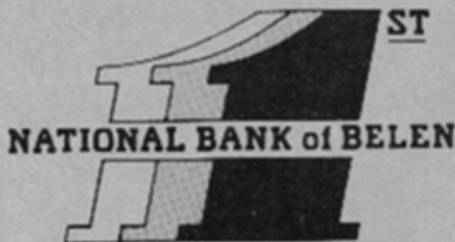
