Awards will be posted in Cowboy Hall after the parade. Please contact a fair board member if you have won an award.

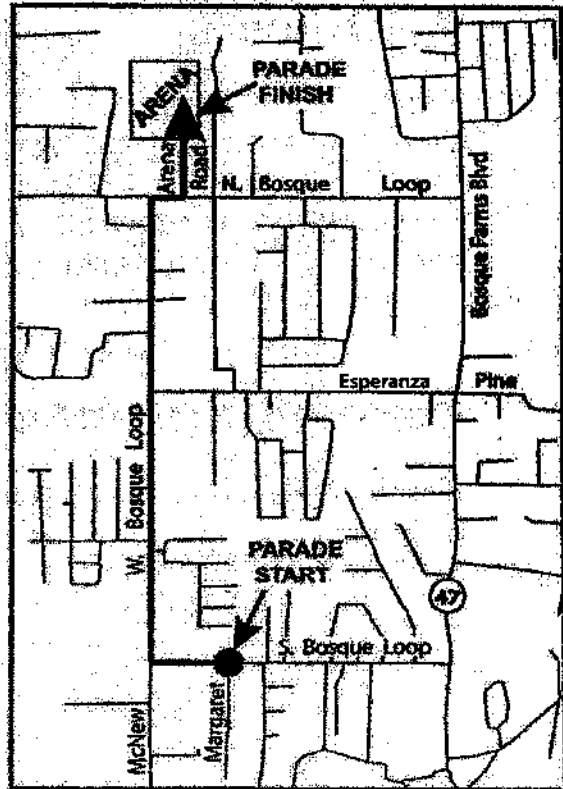

WHAT IS THE BOSQUE FARMS FAIR ASSOCIATION?

The Bosque Farms Fair Association is a non-profit organization of volunteers who do the behind the scenes work of planning and presenting the annual Bosque Farms Fair. Everyone is welcome. If you are looking for a way to become more involved in creating a better community and a better fair, we are looking for YOU! COME JOIN US! THE HISTORY OF BOSQUE FARMS

Our history begins in 1500 when the Tewa Indians lived in our valley. The earliest Spanish settlers arrived next, when Spanish colonists claimed the new world for Spain and were granted land.

Don Solomon Luna had large land holdings in this area. When he died, his son, Don Eduardo Otero, used 28,000 acres for grazing cattle and farming.

In 1934, this land was used by the U.S. government for rehabilitation of farm families relocated from the Great Dust Bowl of northern New Mexico, Texas and Oklahoma. The 28,000 acres were divided into 43 tracts 40 to 80 acres per tract. On May 2, 1935, a public drawing was held, and the tracts were sold to those lucky enough to have their names drawn: The land sold for \$140 per acre, and the new residents had 40 years to pay for it. The new settlement became known as Bosque Farms. The Works Progress Administration (WPA) cleared the land and built homes for the new settlers. Many Spanish style homes are still in use today. In 1939 the WPA built the original Bosque Farms school which is still in use today. At that time, it taught students in grades 1 - 8. The Bosque Farms school was the first school in the state to serve hot lunches to their students. Recreation for the students was community created. Dances, softball games and community dinners were popular. The residents voted to incorporate in 1974.

THE BOSQUE FARMS COMMUNITY FAIR

The Bosque Farms Fair was organized in the summer of 1939 and was sponsored by the Extension Club of Bosque Farms for several years. For the first few years the fair was held on Labor Day.

The first fair opened bright and early with the vast sum of \$14.11 in cash. After much planning it was decided the Extension Club would sponsor the refreshment stand. Mr. and Mrs. Sig McKinzie consented to be in charge of arrangements for the stand. Even though they were very busy all day, they entered several things in the fair, winning several blue and red ribbons along with a champion flower arrangement.

The races for the children created a lot of enthusiasm because of the cash prizes for the winners. First place was fifty cents, second place was twenty-five cents, and third place was ten cents. The money for the prizes was profit made from the Extension Club booth. The first race of the day was a tiny-tot race and each person who entered received five cents even though some did not leave the starting line. The second race was a "hot race" for everyone had to have a toad to enter. (Toads were scarce for weeks after the fair!) Each toad was marked on his back with a number and the child who entered it received a like number. A circle of about 10 feet across was marked off and at the starting whistle the toads were all dumped out of a bucket in the center of the ring. There was a lot of calling and excitement, for the first toad to hop out of the circle won a dollar for his victory. There were various races held throughout the day. Even the women participated in the fair by throwing the rolling pin and driving nails. There were foot races for the fat women as well as skinny ones. When the money ran out, they would call a rest for ten minutes so that people could go to the refreshment stand to spend their winnings on pop, etc. In this way there was money again with which to run more races. After the prizes were distributed for the winning fair exhibits and expenses for the "stand" were settled, they had \$7.50 for a start on next year's fair. As the years went on, they had a "Beauty Contest" with Ann Noble being the first Beauty Queen. In 1942, a preschool "Better Baby" show was held with almost every child in this age group being entered. Robert Morrison was the first contest winner. The motto for the original fair in 1939 was "Bigger and Better."

The first fair was originated by Mrs. Crystal Carpenter. It grew larger and more popular each year. Our fair is the only community fair still celebrated in New Mexico. It reflects the pride our residents still have in our community. Since then, we've enjoyed years of community fun and renewing old friends.

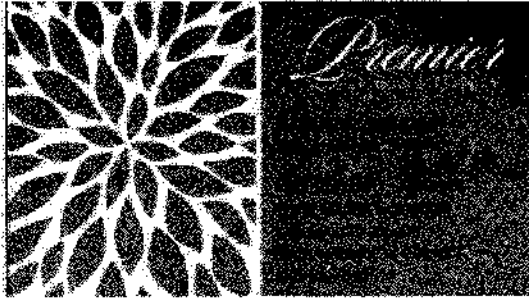

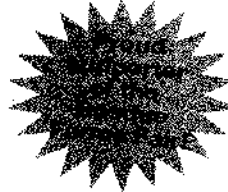

*Must enter event class to be eligible to enter exhibitions. Limit (2) exhibition runs per event, per horse

Divisions:

Leadline: Any age, for beginner rider or horse that needs direct supervision. Rider can be led, have rider behind, as long as the leadliner is reining, can be ponied by another horse, cannot break into a lope.

Novice: The new rider or horse that is still in the schooling stages, i.e. runs barrels with a usual time greater than 25 seconds. Poles usually have time greater than 35 seconds. This is rider discretion.

Intermediate: Skilled rider or horse that usually runs course/courses in competitive times. These are faster than times listed for novice. This is rider discretion.

Bosque Farms Fair Queen, Princess, Sweetheart Contest

Queen

A Queen candidate must be a single girl between the ages of 16 and 20 as of September 1st of this year. She must be a resident of the Bosque Farms Fair Area. Additional rules and information will be provided at the time of registration.

Princess

A Princess candidate must be a single girl between the ages of 12 and 15 as of September 1st of this year. The winner will be selected on the same basis as the Queen.

Sweetheart

A Sweetheart candidate must be a single girl 11 or younger as of September 1st of this year. The winner will be selected on the same basis as the Queen.

-MUST HAVE AT LEAST TWO CONTESTANTS BEFORE RUNNING THE CONTEST. EACH CONTESTANT MUST TURN IN \$25 WITH HER ENTRY FORM.

The Queen will be selected on basis of horsemanship, personality and appearance. It is hoped that she will represent Bosque Farms at the Valencia County Fair Queen contest, but is not required. If the winner chooses to compete at the Valencia County contest, she will receive a cash award to sponsor her effort as well as the crown, buckle and various items donated by individuals and businesses in the community. The cash award is sponsored jointly by the Bosque Farms Fair Association and the Bosque Farms Rodeo Association. A winner who chooses not to compete at Valencia County will not receive the cash award, but will receive all other items.

WHAT IS 4-H?

4-H is the youth education program of the Cooperative Extension Service, established in 1914, and conducted jointly by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the state land-grant universities and county governments.

Today's 4-H program is for all youth, rural and urban, from all racial, cultural, economic and social backgrounds. It reaches girls and boys in a variety of ways: As a member of organized 4-H clubs, as a participant in special interest groups, as enrollees in short-term projects, through camping, and in programs planned to meet specific needs of youth and the communities where they live. Girls and boys "learn by doing" in 4-H.

4-H gives young people an opportunity to take an active part in learning about and solving problems that face them and their communities. Members participate in projects that give them knowledge of science, agriculture, home economics, personal development, community service, leadership and citizenship. Often this knowledge helps open the door to a future career. **THE MAIN PURPOSE OF 4-H IS TO HELP YOUTH BECOME EFFECTIVE CITIZENS.**

Some of the 4-H projects most popular with the youth are food/nutrition, clothing, home beautification, health, safety and leadership. In rural areas, many 4-H members work with livestock, crops, forestry and machinery. Also popular everywhere are projects in electricity, conservation, home gardening, photography, public speaking, woodworking, entomology and personal grooming. Older boys and girls find satisfaction and challenge in projects such as automotive care, career studies, money management, consumer education and leadership. In Valencia County, some of the largest projects are rodeo, horsemanship, livestock judging, leather craft and dog obedience.

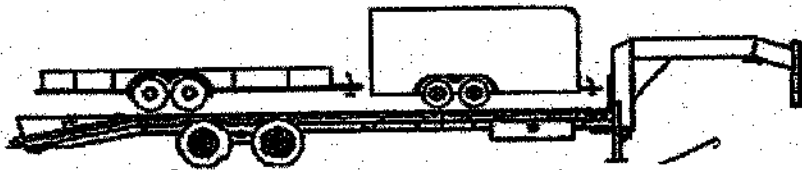

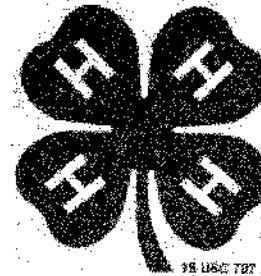

OUTDOOR RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Entries must be pre-registered either Thursday evening between 6:30 & 8:00 p.m. or Friday morning, 8:00 - 12:00 noon at the registration table in the arena building.
2. Only pre-registered animals will be accepted for showing.
3. No one, except superintendents is permitted within 25 feet of the judges during the judging, except when exhibitors are required to show their animals.
4. The same animal may not be shown in both youth and open, however, the same youth may show different animals in youth and open classes.
5. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner and must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 90 days prior to the fair. (YOUTH: See rule 3 under 4-H & FFA Rules.)
6. All animals presented for exhibition shall be free from contagious and infectious diseases or parasites. Any diseased animal will be removed from the grounds.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for their own animals and must provide their own feed, water and containers. **No responsibility is assumed for animals exhibited at the fair.**
8. Animals in livestock classes must be groomed and in show condition.
9. The General Superintendent reserves the right to refuse entry or judging of any animal which, in his or her judgment, is not in suitable health or show condition, is not being properly cared for, or has been subjected to unethical practices such as doctoring, doping or "filling."

The General Superintendent's judgment is final.



4-H & FFA RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Outdoor Rules & Regulations 1-9 apply.
2. Youth exhibits must be from 4-H or FFA projects in which the exhibitor is currently enrolled.
3. All steers must have been owned and managed by the exhibitor for a period of at least 150 days and all other animals for a period of at least 3 months under the supervision of the County Agent or Vocational Agriculture Instructor.
4. The care and fitting of animals is the responsibility of the exhibitor. If instruction and assistance is required, the exhibitor must be present and involved.
5. Weight requirements necessary for entry to the County or State Fairs do not apply.

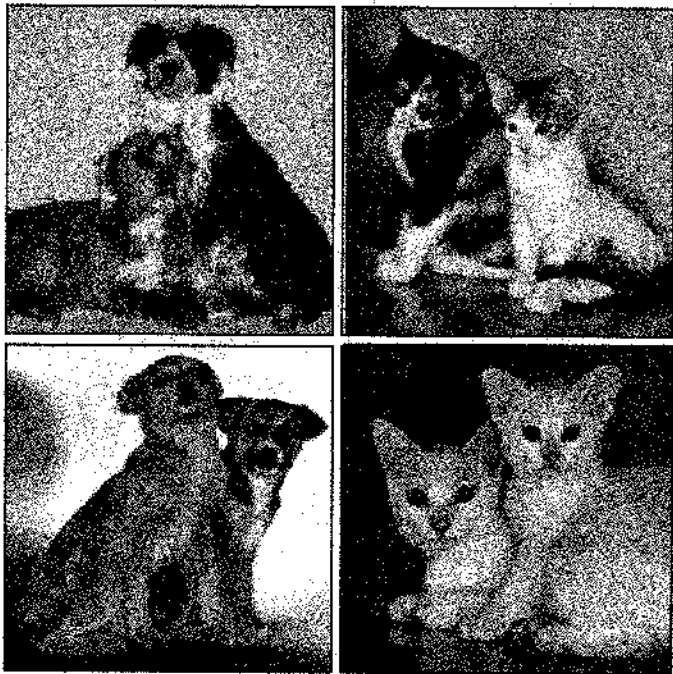

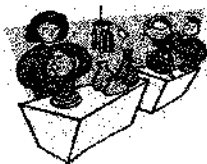

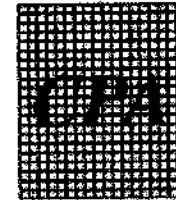
